

Love light

Nestled in the high density housing complex of the Barbican in London, amongst the brutalist architecture of the 1960s, is a little slice of Australia. Interior Designers, Gavin Harris and Henrietta Reed took a 70m² former cleaners storeroom in one of the 160-apartment housing blocks and transformed it into a surprisingly open, light-filled one bedroom apartment.

The original space was small and dark, with minimal light and low ceilings. In order to transform the cramped site, husband and wife team Harris and Reed began by lining the exposed brickwork in plasterboard, removing the ceiling and transforming the redundant kitchen into a bathroom. They then split the long rectangle, logically, into a sleeping area at one end and entertaining at the other, with a long hall linking the two.

Lack of space was a problem, so Harris and Reed installed tricks such as a pivoting dining table concealed behind mirrored doors. The bathroom is also hidden behind mirrored walls. Mirror-lined cupboards along the hall, while narrowing the apartment, also had the effect of making the space seem longer, with the lines in the floorboards adding to the sense of elongation.

Another challenge was to provide a sense of light, with only a single window at either end of the space bringing daylight into the apartment. In order to make the most of this light, mirrors and reflective surfaces were used throughout the apartment. Says Harris, "to encourage an atmosphere of light and air, the apartment palette is simple (generally white) and the surfaces hard and smooth." Adding to this, the electric lighting is concealed and unobtrusive, giving the apartment the impression of being naturally lit, even during the dull London winter.

The focus on light and space was vital for Harris and Reed, who see these two elements as key in Australian design. It was also significant as they designed the space for themselves, being the owner/occupiers of the completed apartment. Says Harris: "[We wanted] to provide the opposite to what London offers, it was to be light, open, modern and clean in detail – to be relaxing to live in without activity. London is always on the go and it becomes tiring after a while."

As an added bonus, the mirrors which reflect natural light into the apartment during the day also shine artificial lighting outside, so that, from below, the apartment sparkles in the night sky. Gavin says that

"the apartment has become a multi-faceted gem hidden within the solidity of the Barbican City".
